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I, Phobonath Sen, son of late Hur Chandra Sen, by caste Kanyast profession landholder, resident of No. 43-1 and 44 Ramkanta Bose's Street Bagbazar, Calcutta, hereby revoke my Will dated the 21st April 1907 and declare this Will duly executed by me to be my last Will and Testament.

2. I have this day attained the age of 74 years 10 months and 8 days and on account of the death of my wife Srimatee Jai Kali Dasi, which took place on the 20th June 1909, I find it necessary to make the present Will in lieu of the one hereby revoked.

3. I hereby direct firstly that a sum of Rupees two to three thousand may be spent for my sradh ceremonies on the due date out of my estate and secondly that the following legacies be paid out of my moveable & properties within a year from the date of my death; while as regards the amounts directed to be paid to my daughters, the same should be paid to the surviving ones among them on the date following my death.

To my five daughters viz; Mannu, Nundi, Shoba, Patore and Rami at Rupees Two hundred each, total Rupees, 1000/-

To my six daughters-in-law at Rupees one hundred and seventy five each, total Rupees 1050/-

To the cousin sister of my wife, Srimatee Anna Kali Dasi, the wife of Arun Chandra Dutt, Rupees 100/-

To the wives of my nephews Chandi Charan Sen and Mani Lal Sen at Rupees one hundred and seventy five each, total Rupees 350/-

To my four nieces named Kotay, Dudi, Chari and Dabur - daughters of my late brother Deba Pramo Nath Sen at Rupees Fifty each, total Rupees 200/-

To Jotindra Nath Dasu Rupees fifty (50/-).

For distribution amongst the servants who may be in my service at the time of my death at the discretion of my sons Monmotho Nath Sen and Sris Chandra Sen.

4. I also hereby direct the following monthly payments to be made to my four relatives, named below, so long as they would live during the continuance of my present lease of the Salt Water Lakes and other lands and fisheries held by me under the Corporation of Calcutta, the payment in respect of each ceasing on her or on his death during the term of the lease aforesaid.

To my sister-in-law Srimati Jagadiswari Dasi, the widow of my late brother Babu Dromho Nath Sen the sum of Rupees five per month for her private charities.

To my aunt-in-law Srimati Dhabotarini Dasi, a sum of Rupees five a month for her expenses, but should she go to Benares, she would receive Rupees fifteen per month, instead of Rupees five only, during the period of her stay at Benares.

To my sister-in-law Srimati Siboo simantini Dasi, wife of Babu Babo Krishna Ghosh, a sum of Rupees thirty per month.

To my niece Srimati Usabala Dasi, wife of Babu Dhivendranath Mitra, a sum of Rupees three per month.

To Satish Chandra Mitra son of my late brother-in-law Babu Annada Prosad Mitra Rupees twenty per month.

5. Should I outline any of the persons named in the preceding paras namely paras 3 & 4, the provision made in his or in her favour therein will not be operative.

6. I bequeath my moveable properties as mentioned in Schedule A hereto attached to my three sons Satish Chandra, Sris Chandra and Nundo Lal Sen, in equal shares, subject to the charges of the payment of legacies, birth expenses etc. mentioned in para 3 and the cost of obtaining a probate of this will. They will also be entitled to all sorts of money which may lapse to my estate owing to the death during my life time, of any of the legacies mentioned in para 3 of this will.

7. Such portion of my net savings as may accumulate and comprise my moveable estate, after payment of all business charges and household expenses, made special or mentioned in para 8 of this will, should first of all be applied for the liquidation of my (sic) debts and recovery of the Government Securities pledged with the Khan Dabus of hakhola, in case they be not redeemed during my life time and as noted in the Schedule hereto attached will go to my three sons viz Satish Chandra Sen, Sris Chandra Sen and Nundo Lal Sen, or in the absence of any of them to his or their respective heirs in equal proportions.

A. They should secondly be applied to the payment of the money due to my sister-in-law, the widow of my late brother Babu Dromhonath Sen and to his sons as mentioned below on account of the security deposit made by them in favour of my third son Hem Nath Sen in connection with the post of cashier held by him under the Great Eastern Hotel Co.

The total of the deposit originally made was Rupees fifteen thousand (15,000/-) out of this amount paid to my sister-in-law on account of the marriage of her three daughters Charoo, and Doodoo + Daboo was rupees two thousand (2,000/-). The amount paid to Chand Charan Sen in full of his share in the abovenamed amount of rupees fifteen thousand (15,000/-) was rupees two thousand (2,000/-) total thus paid off was rupees four thousand (4,000/-). The balance due on the above account is rupees eleven thousand (11,000/-) as under:—

To my sister in law out of rupees seven thousand (7,000/-) received rupees two thousand (2,000/-) paid as above Rs. five thousand (5,000/-). To her two sons Sailendra Nath Sen and Jibondhoo Sen at rupees two thousand (2,000/-) each. rupees four thousand (4,000/-) to her step son Mani Lal Sen rupees two thousand Rs. 2,000/- - Total 11,000/-

B. The abovenamed account was furnished to me by my late wife Srimati Jai Kali Das who had further told me that as regards the rupees two thousand (2,000/-) due to Mani Lal Sen as above - she had advanced several sums of money as loan to different people or through Mani Lal Sen - any portion of such loans which may remain due by or unrecovered from people quite unknown to us and known only to Mani Lal Sen should be a set off against the money payable to Mani Lal Sen as his share of the deposit & money lodged in the hand of the Great Eastern Hotel Company Ltd., as security deposit in favour of my third son Hem Nath Sen. After the whole of the balance of the deposit money is paid off, the total of the deposit money originally made, viz Rupees fifteen thousand of which a portion has been already paid off and the balance when liquidated from my future accumulation as laid down above, the whole of that money viz fifteen thousand rupees (15,000/-) will become the absolute property of my third son Hem Nath Sen who is hereby vested with the absolute proprietary right herein.

C. After the liquidation of my debts and clearance of the two liabilities mentioned above and payment of family and other expenses as hereinafter stated, ^{from the balance} surplus income or savings will after the termination of my lease under the Corporation of Calcutta should be divided into nine (9) equal shares. Six parts thereof will go to my six sons or their respective heirs in equal shares. Two parts thereof will go to my two (2) nephews viz Chand Charan Sen and Mani Lal Sen or to their respective heirs in equal shares - and one part thereof to my other two nephews Sailendra Nath Sen and Jibondhoo Sen or to their heirs in equal shares. Provided that my nephews or any of them do not make a partition with my sons of the family dwelling house Nos 43-1 and 44 Ram Kanta Bose's Street, Calcutta and of the land no. 37 Rosepara lane lately purchased by me for Rupees eight thousand (8,000/-). If they or any of them disregard the above injunction and proceed to a partition of the family dwelling house and land above named ^{and} then they or such of them as would partition off their or his share from the rest shall forfeit all benefits under this my will and shall be bound to restore to my estate such benefits as they or he shall have already derived prior to such partition.

8. As regards my family or household expenses this Will be managed by me during my life time as to me may appear proper, but after my death the above expenses must be limited to rupees one thousand and two hundred (1,200/-) per month and rupees one hundred (100/-) per month for medical treatment and other incidental expenses. I further desire that for the celebration of the annual Anno Karna Bijah a sum not exceeding rupees four hundred (400/-) may be spent by my executors per annum. I further desire that my executors will be at liberty to spend the following sums for the undermentioned Hindu ceremonies per

per annum out of my estate.

For my mother's yearly Sadh rupees hundred (Rs. 100/-)

For my wife's yearly Sadh rupees one hundred and fifty (150/-)

For my yearly Sadh rupees one hundred and fifty (150/-).

Total rupees four hundred (400/-).

9. My object in imposing the restrictions contained in Clause C of para 7 of this document to prevent a division of our family dwelling house immediately after my death will be obvious to every body. It is my earnest desire that my sons and nephews would remain in harmony with one another and thus preserve intact, for some time at least, the dwelling house and the land to its North, the construction and the purchase of which have put me to considerable expenses and anxiety.

10. Landed and Immovable Properties. With regard to the Landed and house hold properties belonging to my estate, I have to state as follows:—

A. One moiety of our family dwelling house 43-1 and 44 Ramkanta Doses Street belongs to me and the other moiety to the heirs of my late brother Dabir Dromho Nath Sen. I have lately purchased a piece of land with old buildings from one Prosonno Chandra Banerjee for rupees two thousand four hundred (2,400/-) my eldest son Brija Nath Sen has built a house upon it for his own exclusive use and accommodation. I desire that this house together with the land and building purchased by me will be enjoyable by my eldest son Brija Nath Sen and his wife during their life time. After them their male heirs will become the sole ^{owners} thereof. Should he require any writing to this effect my executors will do what may be necessary so as to give the heirs of my eldest son the sole proprietary right in the house and land in question.

B. As regards my remaining five (5) sons they will have the entire half share of our present dwelling house and a portion of the land to its North lately purchased by me for rupees eight thousand (8,000/-) as hereinafter provided in para 11.

C. One moiety of house and premises No. 3 Old Dallygunge Road belongs to me and the other moiety to my late brother's widow Stimaty Jagadishwari Dasi and to his two sons by his first wife viz Chand Charan Sen and Mani Lal Sen in the following proportions. One fourth of entire property to Stimaty Jagadishwari Dasi and one fourth thereof to Chand Charan Sen and Mani Lal Sen in equal proportions. My half share in the above together with all other house and landed property, Taluqs or Zaminidary, whether standing in my own name or that of any of my sons, my late wife or other relations or Amlahs will have to be divided into six (6) equal shares.

Five (5) of these will go to my five (5) sons viz Monmoth Nath Sen, Hem Nath Sen, Satish Chandra Sen, Bish Chandra Sen and Nand Lal Sen or to their respective heirs in equal shares and one portion thereof will be fully enjoyed by eldest son Brija Nath Sen and his wife during their life time and after them they will go to their male heirs in equal shares. But no division will be made by my sons or their next heirs, of our family dwelling house Nos 43-1 and 44 Ramkanta Doses Street and land No. 37 Dose para lane lately purchased by me for which latter a separate bequest is made in para 11.

11. I desire that the land to the North of our family dwelling house lately purchased by me should be divided into eight (8) equal shares. Five (5) of them will go to my five (5) sons viz Monmoth Nath Sen, Hem Nath Sen, Satish Chandra Sen, Bish Chandra Sen and Nand Lal Sen and two portions thereof to my nephews Chand Charan Sen and Mani Lal Sen and one

one portion to the male heirs of my eldest son Brij Nath Sen.

12. I am aware that my sons being bound by my solemn wish that they would on no account make a partition amongst themselves or with my nephews at their own instance I see no way of binding my nephews by mere wish alone. I have therefore imposed some restrictions in Clause C of para 7 of this document with the object of keeping my sons and nephews in harmony with each other. Over and above the restrictions referred to above I further wish that as I am giving the land referred to in this para to my two nephews and six sons in equal shares, I hereby state that if my nephews Chandu Chander Sen and Manilal Sen or their next heirs make a partition with my sons or their heirs, of their shares in the family dwelling house they will not only be deprived of the benefit of enjoying two shares of the surplus income or savings referred to in Clause C of para 7 but will also be deprived of the two shares in the land lately purchased by me to the North of our family dwelling house. Should my nephews construct any buildings on any portion of the above land and make subsequent partition of our family dwelling house or of the land in question I am now giving to them then the above shares will thereupon revert to my estate with any buildings that might have been erected thereon and will go to my sons with the rest as provided above.

(sic) 13. Besides the abovenamed moveable and immovable estate I have got the lease of several properties comprising land fisheries and bazars and all belonging to the Corporation of Calcutta to Government and to the estate of the late late Maharajah Bahadur Sir Jotindra Mohan Nagore K.C.S.I. in the 24 Per gunnabs. These I direct should be in the sole charge of my executors the working members of which namely Monmotho Nath Sen and Krish Chunder Sen will receive a monthly allowance of Rs. 50 (fifty) each for the time and trouble they would devote for managing the same - they will as far as possible act in concert with the general body of my executors whose work in connection with the above named properties may be briefly defined as noted below.

A. They will manage the above to the best advantage of the estate.

B. They will pay all charges of management and family and other expenses as hereinbefore mentioned and pay all my existing debts out of the profits of the leasehold properties.

C. After discharging the above they will hold the surplus savings or income in trust in their hands investing the same as to the majority of them may appear proper and finally after the expiration of the term of my existing lease under the Corporation they will divide the whole amount thereof in manner and subject to the restrictions laid down in Clause C of para 7 of this document.

(sic) 14. The lease I hold from the Calcutta Corporation is subject to the performance of a very onerous work and to certain other conditions which cannot be performed or fulfilled by persons having interests distinct from one another. I therefore will and direct that my executors shall carry on the business in my name and perform the work and fulfill the conditions upon which depends the continuance of the lease and that the lease shall rest in them upon trust in the first place to pay and discharge expenses and outgoings of and incidental to the said business and work and in the second place to defray all family and other expenses as hereinbefore mentioned and pay my just debts, and lastly to invest the surplus income or profits if any for the purpose of a reserve fund to meet any unforeseen or extraordinary charges or expenses of the said business arising from causes beyond control such as strikes epidemics etc and also to meet expenses of improvements such as my executors should think proper, and after the expiration of the present term of my lease to divide the net amount at credit of the said reserve fund amongst my sons and nephews or their heirs as laid down in Clause C of para 7 but not to their or any of their assigns and

I further will and direct that none of my sons shall be competent to transfer their prospective share to such division of the reserve fund aforesaid and that if any of my sons were to transfer or create a charge on such prospective share, he should instantly forfeit such share.

15. In conclusion I appoint the following to be the executors of this my Will.

1. Monmotho Nath Sen.
2. Chundry Charan Sen
3. Mami Lal Sen
4. Hem Nath Sen.
5. Satish Ch. Sen
6. Srish Chundra Sen

They or any of them will have the power to name in their stead any other gentleman whom the rest of the executors may approve.

(sic) 16. Should there be any difference of opinion amongst the executors the same may be referred to my nephews Ashutosh Sen or to my eldest son Pro Nath Sen whose decision about the matter in dispute will be final.

We whose names are subscribed below do declare that the testator Babu Dhobonath Sen has signed his name in the presence of us all being present at the same time and that we have hereunto signed our respective names as attesting witnesses in his presence and in the presence of one another dated the 20th day of May 1910.
