

Order no. 2, dated 16.9.88 :Petitioner files hazira and certain documents. As prayed for, the case is taken up for hearing. Heard. This is an application filed by one Gamesh chandra Bhattacherjee, who happens to be the sole Sebait to the Debuttar estate of the Deity Jagaddal', prayi. mg for permission to sell the property as described in the schedule to the petition. Itis stated that the yields of the property is too meagre to carry on the seva puja of the deity and other religious performances, that he is unemplo he has no sufficient personal income to carry on with the seva pujaofthe deity regularly as directed by the settlor and that by the proposed sale, he will be able to remmovate the Mandir and secure a regular source of income for the Seva puja for which the debuttar had been intended. But it is stated that the property is a private Debuttar and for thepurpose of dealing with the same, the permission of the Court is not necessary. The petitioner


