This Indenture made this Eighteenth day of September in the year of Christ one thousand nine hundred and five BETWEEN as
 Hara Lal Kundu, Moti Lal Kundu, Rama Lal Kundu and Chuni Lal Kundu sons of Gosain Das Kundu deceased all of No. 44 Sutton Lucas Garden Street in Calcutta
 in the town of Calcutta by caste Brahmin - land holders and Traders (hereinafter together referred to as the said Vendors) of the First part. Pramati Namini moni Dasi widow of the said Gosain Das Kundu deceased of the same place Hindu widow of the Second part and Buldeo ram Mohanta
 son of Maganram Mohanta deceased and Raman Lal Mohanta son of Mohanram Mohanta deceased
 both of No. 28 Shoboo Thakur Lane in Calcutta aforesaid Hindu Brahmins Traders (hereinafter together referred to as the said Purchasers) of the Third part AND WHEREAS one Goluck Chunder Kundu who was a
 Hindu Trader of Calcutta governed by the Bengal School of Hindu Law died intestate about Ninety -
 years ago leaving four sons namely Gopi mohan Kundu, Tara Chand Kundu, Ram Kusto Kundu and
 Beer Chand Kundu his heirs him surviving and leaving considerable property both movable and immovable AND WHEREAS after his death his said four sons took possession of the Estate left by him
 and continued to live together as members of a Hindu family joint in food worship and Estate AND
 WHEREAS the said Gopi mohan Kundu and Tara Chand Kundu on behalf of the said joint family
 carried on from the Twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and Twenty four an extensive
 business in Glass Ware in partnership with one Ram Pratap Dutt at No. 60 New China Bazar Street
 in Calcutta under the name style and firm of Gopi mohan Kundu and Company in which the said
 joint family in the names of the said Gopi mohan Kundu and Tara Chand Kundu had a two third
 share, and the said Ram Pratap Dutt the remaining one third AND WHEREAS the said Gopi mohan
 Kundu died intestate on or about the Twenty first day of September one thousand eight hundred
 and Thirty two, leaving as only son Madhusudan Kundu him surviving and thereupon the said
 Madhu Sudan Kundu succeeded his father in the said Glass ware business AND WHEREAS the
 surviving three sons of the said Goluck Chunder Kundu and the said Madhusudan Kundu some
 time in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and Thirty Three out of their share of the
 income of the said Glass ware business purchased a parcel of land measuring about six bighas in
 Sutton Lucas Garden Street in Calcutta and erected a messuge or dwelling house thereupon being the
 premises No. 44 Sutton Lucas Garden Street which are hereinafter particularly described and intended
 to be merely granted and conveyed AND WHEREAS on or about the Twenty eighth day of August one
 thousand eight hundred and Thirty nine the said Madhusudan Kundu died without leaving any issue
 or widow surviving him AND WHEREAS the said Ram Kusto Kundu subsequently died without issue
 but leaving a widow Kura main Dasi AND WHEREAS after the deaths of the said Madhusudan Kundu
 the name of the said Beer Chand Kundu was introduced in the said partnership along with that of the
 said Tara Chand Kundu on behalf of the said joint family AND WHEREAS the said Ram Kusto
 Dutt died in the month of December one thousand eight hundred and forty seven and thereupon his
 only son Goroo Charan Dutt succeeded to his share and interest in the said partnership business
 AND WHEREAS disputes and differences having thereto arisen between the partners the accounts of
 the said partnership were made up and adjusted, and the said Goroo Charan Dutt retired from the
 said partnership business on payment to him of the sum of Rupees Four thousand for his share therein
 and the said business was thenceforth carried on by the said Tara Chand Kundu and Beer Chand
 Kundu on their own account AND WHEREAS the said Tara Chand Kundu died intestate in the year
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty one leaving an only son the said Gopan Das Kundu him
 surviving AND WHEREAS the said Beer Chand Kundu died intestate in the year one thousand eight
 hundred and eighty seven leaving neither widow nor issue him surviving but leaving the said Gosain
 Das Kundu his nephew his sole heir AND WHEREAS the said Haranmoni Dasi died in the year one thousand
 and ninety seven AND WHEREAS the said Gosain Das Kundu died intestate in the year one thousand eight hundred
 and Ninety eight leaving the said Namini moni Dasi his sole widow and the said vendors his
 and

and heirs him surviving AND WHEREAS dissensions having arisen between the said widow & sons
of the said Gosain Das Kundu the said Rama Lal Kundu and Moti Lal Kundu separated in & from
the said Rama Lal Kundu and Chooney Lal Kundu and Kamini moni Dasi since about the month of
May one thousand nine hundred and Three, and on the Fourteenth day of March one thousand nine
hundred and four institutes a suit being suit No. 227 of one thousand nine hundred and four in the
High Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal in its Ordinary Original Civil Jurisdiction against
the said Kamini moni Dasi Rama Lal Kundu and Chooney Lal Kundu for inter alia account
and declaration of the shares of the said Plaintiffs in the said premises No. 141 Rutton Seicas Garden
Street, and for partition thereof AND WHEREAS by the decree of the said High Court in the said suit &
bearing date the Twenty eighth day of June one thousand nine hundred and five it was declared that
subject to the right of maintenance of the said Plaintiff Kamini moni Dasi the said Rama Lal Kundu
and Moti Lal Kundu the Plaintiffs in the said suit were jointly entitled to one equal half part share
of inter alia the said premises No. 141 Rutton Seicas Garden Street, and that the said Rama Lal
Kundu and Chuni Lal Kundu were jointly entitled to the other equal half part or share thereof, and that
a partition of the said premises between the said parties was directed AND WHEREAS the said partition of
the said premises has not been made, and in consequence of the contract for sale of the said premises
hereafter mentioned is intended to be abandoned AND WHEREAS the said Vendors have agreed with the said
Purchasers for the absolute sale to them of the said premises No. 141 Rutton Seicas Garden Street free
from incumbrances at or for the price or sum of Rupees Thirty two thousand AND WHEREAS the said
Plaintiff Kamini moni Dasi has agreed to give in these presents for the purpose of releasing the said
agreement and in consideration of the sum of Rupees Thirty Two thousand of the lawful money of British
India in hand well and truly paid by the said Purchasers to the said Vendors with the knowl-
edge and assent of the said Plaintiff Kamini moni Dasi, at or immediately before the execution of these
presents (the receipt whereof they the said Vendors and the said Plaintiff Kamini moni Dasi do sub each
of them both hereby admit and acknowledge) and from the payment of the same and of any part
thereof hereby release and for ever discharge the said Purchasers their heirs representatives and assigns as
well as the said premises, and every part thereof. They the said Vendors do sub each of them do hereby
according to their respective shares right title and interest grant transfer convey release and assure
And the said Plaintiff Kamini moni Dasi doth hereby release, and confirm unto the said Purchasers their heirs
representatives and assigns All that party three stories and parlor two storied brick built messen-
ger house, and dwelling house together with the piece or parcel of rent free land there unto
belonging, and wherein or on part whereof the same is erected and built containing by estimate in Five
Gottas and eight Ghittacks be the same a little more or less situate lying at and being No. 141 Rutton
Seicas Garden Street in Situinity on the North Division of the Town of Calcutta and butted to & bounded
in manner following (that is to say) On the North by Rutton Seicas Garden Street On the East by Rai
Dinendra Narain Basu Lane On the South by Roy's Lane and On the West by the house of Ape dra
Chunder Mullik. Or howsoever otherwise the said messenger land hereditaments and premises now are
or is or heretofore were or was situate butted bounded called known numbered described or dis-
tinguished Together with all buildings yards Court yards areas towers drains water courses lights liber-
eights Appurtenances and Appurtenances whatsoever to the said messenger land hereditaments
