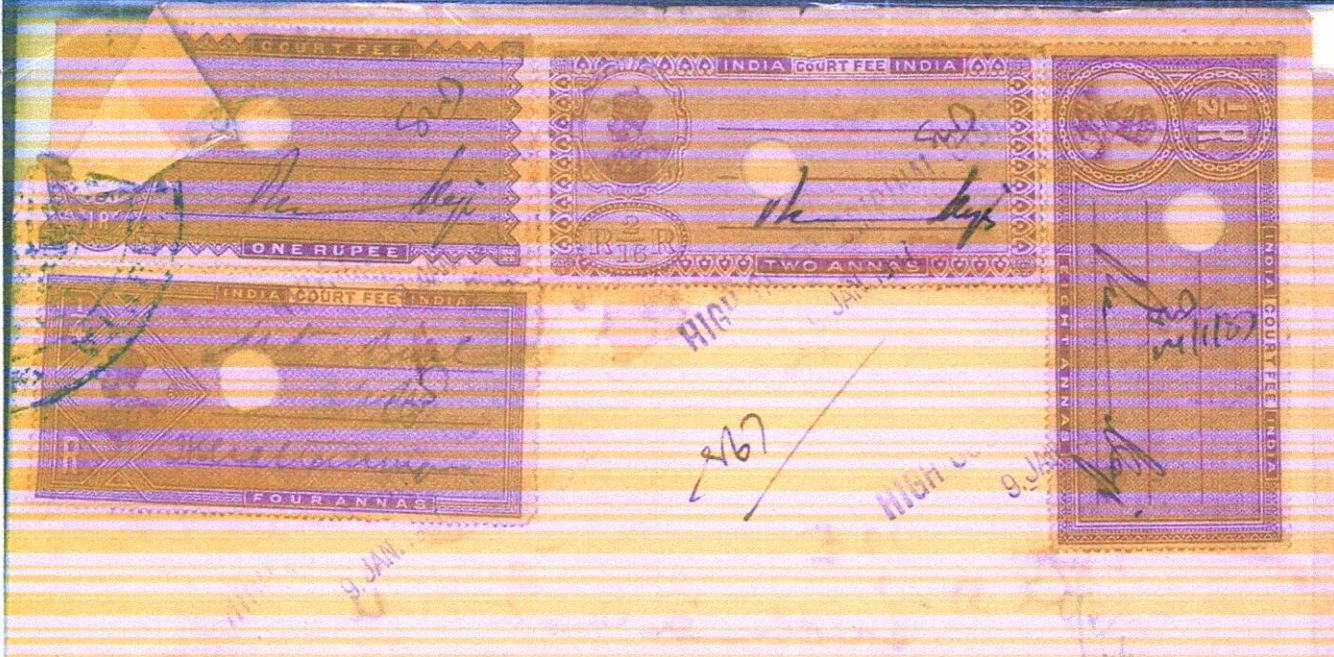

said terms ought to be carried out and the same are ordered and

Schedule 'A' referred to in the annexed decree made in suit No. 280 of 1936 and dated the 19th day of November, 1936.

Terms of Settlement.

1. There will be a declaration that the plaintiff as the sole heir of Girish Chandra Kunda deceased is the absolute owner of the house and premises No. 101, Serpentine Lane in the town of Calcutta.
2. There will be a decree for possession of the said house and premises against the defendants as also for mesne profits at the rate of Rs. 25/- per month for a period of three years upto the date of the institution of this suit amounting to Rs. 900/- and also for mesne profits at the same rate thereafter till possession be -- delivered up to the plaintiff, provided that if the defendants make over vacant and peaceful possession of the said premises to the plaintiff within six months from this date the plaintiff will give up the mesne profits and will not execute the decree so far as -- mesne profits are concerned.
3. The defendants are given six months' time from this date to give up possession of the said premises to the plaintiff.
4. The defendants to pay to the plaintiff the costs of the suit on Scale No. II to be taxed if required.
